



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THE MANY LANGUAGES OF A CHILD! - by Dr. Neelam Malik.

The National Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020), approved by the_Union Cabinet of India on 29 July 2020, is the new vision for India's education system. Of the many provisions of this policy, the one that has garnered the highest amount of discussion is the generous use of the mother tongue or the native language as the medium of instruction.

So, what exactly does this entail? Is the teacher supposed to speak in her own Mother tongue or does she learn the mother tongue of the child, which may or may not be the same as that of other children or her own? And what about multi-lingual families where the child is exposed to different languages at home itself?

Learning is important, not teaching -

In my opinion, what matters is that "Learning" should take place, irrespective of the language.

But even before we address the idea of learning, let's discuss creating an environment conducive to the exchange of ideas assimilating information, and for creating new conceptual references. All these take place when there is a free exchange of ideas and thoughts.

And this free exchange is possible in the natural language of a child. The language in which one dreams is the natural language.

Expression precedes the spoken language -

Let us take a few examples - A child is sitting quietly, looking blankly at a wall. What is the child telling? Is the child communicating anything through silence? It could be boredom, tiredness, loneliness or anything else. Doesn't the work of the teacher entail deciphering the said and the unsaid aspects of language?

A child expresses through his or her expressions, through sign language, by pointing at things, through sounds, actions and even through silence. A child's distracted mumbling expresses more than intentional speech. All these expressions are documented.

The role of a teacher and parent -

It is important for a teacher and a parent to speak pure languages with correct pronunciation and the right grammar. Whether it is English in the case of an English medium school or any regional language, they need to speak the language fluently so that children learn the language correctly. That is because a child's very basic way to learn the spoken language is by listening.

Children also need to learn in a "Stress-free environment". One needn't always translate when a child speaks in a regional language. When a child speaks in a mother tongue, whether the teacher understands the language or not, the teacher needs to 'communicate' with the child.

As pointed out earlier, a child gives many cues to the spoken language through expressions and actions. The teacher can also use assistance from another teacher or another child to help understand what is being said. Forcing a child to speak in a particular language not only deters free expression but also creates a stressful environment. Language delays and stuttering are often a result of such stress.

And I believe, avoiding this stress is the crux of the Mother tongue discussion that all academicians and teachers need to pick on, rather than going into the why and how of the matter.

The 100 different languages of a child -

A language need to be lived! During my visit to Reggio Emilia, a town in Italy known for its "Reggio method" of Preschool education, I found that they speak in only Italian, but still believe in the idea of 100 different 'languages' of children. Here learning takes place organically. In their context, even the play-way method seems restricted and narrow.

In our effort to replicate the experience in our schools, we created a 'Perfume Garden'. It was an experience created for the kids in an outdoor space where children could manipulate a variety of seeds, flowers, oils, leaves, plants, stones, etc. They played in the mud, held the clay, expressed using colours or merely looked around, smelling the different smells, touching different textures and spoke to each other. No instructions were given, children were not asked to 'do' or 'create' anything. Yet we found that maximum learning took place. That was the power of the '100 languages of a child'.

Similarly, experiential learning fosters language development. In my experience, children's learning gets a boost when they go on field trips or even a school picnic as compared to what they get in class.





The ever-evolving nature of languages -

Coming back to the mandate of elaborate usage of the "Mother Tongue" in preschool education, I feel communication should happen naturally. It should not be a deliberate effort.

Language is constantly evolving! Today, 5 and 6 year old speak the language of the Internet, most parents call it the 'YouTube' language. Popular media is affecting the way they speak. Peppa Pig fans speak in the British accent, whereas, young gaming enthusiasts will throw words such as 'noob' and 'imposter' at you. And unicorn Edutech companies see this as an opportunity to lure parents to teach their children the language of software too, through Coding!

Is it possible that we educationists, teachers, or socalled elders are somehow speaking a language that is obsolete? And if so, how capable are we to decide the language of expression for the young ones? And where does the whole discussion regarding Mother tongue lie in the current scheme of things? Could it be possible that this could be an obsolete area of discussion too? Or are we trying to turn simple concepts into complicated cryptic messages?



BELIEVE IN PRAYERS! ALWAYS BE CAUTIOUS BUT DO NOT BE FEARFUL!

There are many questions that our students have on their minds. Our Student Council members posed these questions to Principal Ma'am. Read her responses, where she shares new insights and new ways of thinking about the current situation, that will help you look at things differently!

The pandemic has changed the world in many ways. Do you think that the world will ever be back to how it was before the pandemic?

Radhamani Ma'am's reply - Situations depend on how you perceive them. Didn't we face any challenge

before the pandemic? But right now, the challenges are faced collectively and globally and therefore, it is getting noticed. This collective experience is what has made the pandemic a well-defined challenge.

The 'World Wide Web', the 'WWW', was present even before the pandemic. But we were not using it to the optimum. Now we are using it more prominently. It has got the chance to come forward and create disruptions. So, this is a major realisation for all of us.

I had attended a seminar 5 years back. There it was discussed how the whole world is going to come on one platform and communication will be crucial. It was discussed that someday humans will travel from one place to another in shorter time spans, for e.g., from India to America in just 40 minutes and that Passenger Space Shuttles will be a possibility. Who knows what the future holds! But the possibilities are endless. We must be open to them and adapt to new definitions of normal.

We have seen you encouraging and motivating others. What was the driving force that helped you stay positive and productive during pandemic?

For me, my students and your enthusiasm are my biggest motivation. As we grow older, we drive into a self-motivation mode. I immensely believe in the power of prayer. In life many challenges will come. Our ability to face them depends on our perception, and that depends on our inner strength that comes with meditation, prayers, and a belief system.

What do you think the future holds? How do you think this generation will grow up to be as citizens of our country?

I don't think anyone of us can predict the future. Other than astrology, which is a science, there is no way of fully knowing the future. But we know what's happening now, in the present. I strongly believe in the famous quote in our Bhagwat Geeta, that is, 'Karma karo, phal ki chinta mat karo'. Keep doing your work even if you are unsure what the future holds.

My earnest request to the young generation is do not waste the present time and the present opportunities. Sometimes to know things better, we need to go through some difficult situations. For example-When you learn to cook. In your first attempt, the food will never taste that good. Either the salt will be too much, or spices will be less. The next time it will be better and as you keep on making mistakes, you learn how to do it better. The same is applied to life. You make mistakes and you learn. The current times has hindered physical activities, especially for students. But they are also getting experts at self-management. It is individual decisions to choose the school sponsored physical activities, or any other activities to keep yourself fit and





this self-management is one major change which 21st century students will experience life differently. Online learning itself means learning to be independent and learning independently. There is no one to impose and children are learning selfmonitoring method gradually and that is a great boon for future leaders. I urge my students to indulge in a lot of physical play at home. You can do this by creating playing spaces at home. Practicing new hobbies or gaining mastery over an art at home can also be done.

Frontline warriors are considered as Gods. How can each one of us contribute towards the betterment of the nation at our own level?

I would like to say that most of us are already contributing. The first and second waves of Covid were combatted and brought under control. That was only possible because we adhered to the safety precautions of social distancing. Not wearing masks is being rebellious and that is not contributing to the nation. Front line workers are deeply motivated. Their lives are at stake, but they continue doing their duties, so they are of a different league altogether. I want to stress that we all can do simple things to contribute to the society. It can be as simple as providing groceries or homemade food to people who have covid patients at home or delivering milk or medicines to the elderly. I have seen adults throwing wrappers and littering places. Our essential service workers are already tired. We must not increase their work. In a nutshell, I feel, acquiring joy in doing small, simple things is more important than performing any extraordinary act. For students to come online and keep the learning going is a big contribution and I salute you students!

Parents' lives revolve around children. Many parents feel that Online learning is making their children lazy, its straining their eyes and affecting their health. What do you think?

I completely agree with parents. The amount of time spent in front of the screen should be reduced. Earlier, when you had physical school, you did not study online but after school went and watched TV. Now with online education, I hope screen time for entertainment has reduced and productive screen time has increased. Therefore, in effect, screen time remains the same as earlier. Prioritising the entertainment screen time and productive screen time is individual decision. Some parents also have the concerns about online learning. They worry that their child's education will remain stagnant for the whole time of the pandemic. I would say here, dear parents, the current generation children are going to be the most creative one and problem solvers. The prime requirement is to be in present, accept change and to continue with education on this new platform.

Parents have a lot of faith in students and schools? But will the assessments be fair. Are teachers able to assess students equally and are the exams fair?

I have a question for you, do we get any question papers in life? Or do we get time to prepare for life? No. right? Uncertainty prevails in life and that is the nature of life. We must be alert. Live in the present. School assessments are done after preparation. Please understand that the aim of assessments is learning. They help to know how much is learnt and what needs to be learnt. During Online exams, students were selfmonitoring. 80% of the students have decided that they will self-manage. What happened to the other 20% who decided that it is okay to take support? They searched for the answers, went through their books and in turn learning took place. The CBSE board has changed assessments to include more case studies. This will test student's thinking skills, curiosity, creativity etc. This presents a great opportunity for us to change the education system.

Can you give the readers of Amitam a thought that they can follow?

Always be cautious but do not be fearful! Whenever faced with an uncertainty follow the following steps -Tell yourself to relax; then Observe the situation objectively, without getting emotionally involved; then Think; and then respond.

I always follow the above technique. Even when the lockdown began in March last year and we did not know how to tackle the situation, I applied the same technique and in March itself we were able to conduct our first Online Examinations and then we were able to connect with our students on Microsoft Licenced software.

So even when your parents feel stressed, you can tell them 'Please Relax'!






