








The shloka is a basic tenet in existence from the time of the Vedas and beyond and represents the hierarchy in which one should respect these entities. Love is Pure, Selfless, Divine, and Eternal. We get this divine Love from our parents.



The plight of a Tree.


Once stood a tall tree in a bright and green forest,

Azalea: translates to "Rose Tree". Symbolizes: temptation, caution and danger.



Baby's breath: named due to delicate and soft petals.
Symbolizes: purity, innocence and love.



Blue Daisy: means "happy". Symbolizes: happiness, purity and innocence.
